Give Back 2017

As our 50th anniversary approaches, Woodbury Lutheran has been looking back to celebrate where we've been and looking forward to where God is calling us in the future. One of many strengths of our Woodbury Lutheran family is our generosity. We are generous with our time, our prayers, and our finances. For 5 decades we've supported our community, shared our resources, and been a place that trusts God to provide what we need.

This Easter, we were challenged as a congregation to give cheerfully and told that 100% of the Easter weekend offering would be given away within the following couple of weeks to organizations in our community that serve those in need.

WLC family, we showed up in a powerful way. We stretched beyond what has ever been given, and we gave without knowing who would be blessed by our generosity. Our faith family across 3 campuses gave just over \$100,000. The week after Easter, three organizations were revealed as the primary recipients of our Easter offering. Each organization was gifted just over \$30,000.

New Life Family Resources (First Care) is an organization that WLC has partnered with for a long time. Their heart for moms and dads in crisis is obvious as they offer free ultrasounds, counseling, resources, classes, and help folks with the adoption process.

Source MN is an organization that helps people escape and heal from sex trafficking. They are an organization that's been serving our community for 5 years and have already found impressive success in serving folks who often are overlooked or ignored.

Arrive Ministries is an organization that serves refugee families and helps them to settle into our community. They've welcomed hundreds of refugees and their success is found in their mutually transformational approach of partnering churches and small groups with each family.

Each of these organizations embody parts of who we are here at WLC. We value and are rooted in God's truth, we seek to value each person, we compassionately care for our community, and with the Holy Spirit's power bring hope to the hurting, we live out our

faith through movement, and most of all we are people with a mission to help folks to be disciples of Jesus and be transformed by Him.

This weekend, April 29-30th, there's going to be another reveal and challenge connected to the remaining \$10,000 from our Easter offering. Be sure to check out <u>Easter.woodburylutheran.org</u> for more information and stories after the reveal

It's a joy for me to serve here at a congregation that shares so generously in the name of Jesus. I am excited to see how God multiplies what He's already planted here over the next weeks and years.

It's Not Good to Be Alone...

This month I'm sharing with you an article that I saw in the Better Health newsletter.

God in His infinite wisdom knew from the beginning that it's not good for us to be alone. Studies in human behavior greatly support that wisdom; having friends and interacting with others is good for our health. Numerous studies show that being alone has an effect on a variety of health aspects:

Researchers at Brigham Young University reported that having only a few friends can be as dangerous for you as smoking 15 cigarettes a day. Conversely, people who have a large group of friends may live 22 percent longer that those with only a few friends.

An Ohio State University study found that loneliness can weaken the immune system. Those in the study with

numerous social ties were four times less likely to catch a cold virus that those with few social relationships. Furthermore, the stress associated with feelings of loneliness can generate inflammation throughout the body, leading to a range of health risks.

A Harvard study found that middle-aged adults who live alone have a 24 percent increased risk of dying of heart disease.

Other smaller studies have found that having friends lowers stress because you can have more social support and regular contact with people to whom you can share your concerns.

Thank God that through His grace and love He restored our relationship with Him, allowing us to build relationships with others. When you take time to nurture your rela-

tionships with family, friends and coworkers through interaction, play and forgiveness, you are exercising your relational well-being.

OAK HILL UPDATES


Here are some quick updates from our Oak Hill Campus:

Mo Do You Say JAm?

I'm a foster mom, and kids come in and out of our home. Most of the time we have no idea how long they will be staying, and almost immediately I am hit with the idea that I may only have a short amount of time to pour into them.

Most kids come into foster care with stuff—no, not socks, shirts, and underwear. More like trauma, stress, and anxiety. While this sometimes throws a curveball into our family dynamic, our goal is to keep moving along, doing whatever we possibly can do to give these kids a sense of normalcy, a sense of family. Even though they may not be here forever, we want to instill in them morals, boundaries, and character, and we want them to get a taste of Jesus Christ. We want them to leave our home knowing that their worth and identity are in Jesus Christ.

One way I have started doing this with our girls is by speaking words of identity to them each morning while I brush their hair. We stand in front of the bathroom mirror together, the girl looking at herself and me standing behind her brushing her hair. I start out by saying, "You are beautiful." She looks herself in the eye and repeats, "I am beautiful." We do this with several other phrases, like "You are strong," "You are kind," and "You are smart." I have also recently begun adding Scripture. So now, "You are beautiful" is followed by "God made us in His image" (Genesis 1:27), and "You are strong," is followed by "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13).

It was awkward at first because our girls lacked so much self-confidence. Our five year old truly didn't believe that she was worthy of our love, let alone God's love. I am glad that we moved past the awkwardness because now it is just part of our routine. I want these children to remember these moments forever. I want them to look into the bathroom mirror wherever they are and remember that they are beautiful, strong, kind, smart, and, most importantly, that they are children of God, redeemed and loved. It even brings me to tears to think that one day each of them could be brushing her own daughter's hair and remember to speak these same words over her.

I challenge you to make a tradition of speaking identity over your kids, whether they are like our children transitioning back to their biological families or even teenagers transitioning to college and adulthood. Imagine the difference we can make in the next generation as children grow up with their identity rooted in Christ.
