Just One Weekend

The Weekend of October 10th & 11th will be "Just One Weekend" at Woodbury Lutheran Church across our campuses. "Just One Weekend" (JOW) is your opportunity, as a disciple of Jesus the Christ, to invite just one person who is disconnected from Jesus or a worshiping community to worship and/or Sunday School at Woodbury Lutheran Church. Invite a friend, a neighbor, a co-worker, a family member, or a stranger to join us that weekend as we proclaim and celebrate what God has done for all of creation through Jesus Christ. "Just One Weekend" will have a genuine and friendly environment like we always have at Woodbury Lutheran. The focus from our preachers and teachers will be to share who Jesus Christ is in ways that an unbeliever might be able to connect with. We invite you to bring "Just One!"

Perhaps you are thinking, as you read this article, that the person that you are thinking of is not ready to come to a church service or building, yet. This might be due to a variety of reasons, like: they have been hurt in the past by a church community, they are intimidated by the idea of corporate worship, or worship seems foreign to them, etc. For some, this is quite true. If that is the case in your relationship, I encourage you to be patient, to pray, and to be invitational in unique ways. You could invite that person over for lunch or dinner, or out for coffee, and ask them some sincere questions about their life...and listen well to them as you do this! Ask them about their passions. Ask them about their story. What childhood was like and what the journey of life has been like. Don't critique or judge, just listen. Be ready to share your life back with them, if they ask you about your story. And perhaps, just like the Apostle Peter writes, they may get to a place where they ask you about the Hope that you have. Be prepared to share that Hope in an articulate way with gentleness and respect. This is how Peter writes to the disciples scattered throughout Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey) about doing so: *"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do*

this with gentleness and respect." (1 Peter 3:15).

As you point to Jesus, the One that you hope in, and not to yourself or the things of this world, the Holy Spirit may just work in His beautiful and mysterious ways to draw your dear brother or sister into learning more about this Jesus and His church on earth. Some of you may be at a place in your relationship with that person where you need the nudge from the Holy Spirit to ask them to come and join us on "Just One Weekend." Here is that nudge: Get over yourself and your fear of being turned-down. Gently and respectfully extend an invite, that they might join us in hearing out and worshipping the One True Lord, Jesus the Christ!

We'll see you and your friend(s) on the 10th and 11th!



A Mission Experience in Quito

A team of 15 went to Quito, Ecuador from July 23rd to August 2nd: five from Woodbury Lutheran and ten from theAlley. With a variety of ages and life stages, our team bonded much better than most of us probably expected. We worked with Youth World and International Teams and were hosted by Aaron and Amanda Voth – two supported missionaries from Woodbury Lutheran Church. Amanda's job is to host teams through Quito Quest (a Youth World ministry) and Aaron typically works with college students but was allowed to partner with Amanda to host our team. It was a blessing for the team to be able to pour into our sent missionaries and learn from them on the field.

Amanda and Aaron did a nice job of describing our ministry:

We just finished hosting a team from theAlley and Woodbury Lutheran... We spent the first half of their stay at a church called Dios Es Amor (God Is Love), where we helped paint the church, participated in some children's programs, and visited the homes of community members the church was trying to reach out to. The connection with this site was special and it was difficult to say goodbye. There were some very powerful times of prayer for the leadership and the youth of the church. Then we traveled to Riobamba, where we partnered with an indigenous Quichua community to work on their church property and run some kids' programs. Overall it was a really fun 10 days, and a great chance to grow closer to old friends and new from home!

A blessing I have noticed from going on a short-term mission experience, and one in particular that involves our sent missionaries, is that we were

able to validate their experiences in Ecuador. Now they have a little larger support network back in Minnesota that understands some of the work they have been doing, met some of the same friendly believers they have been spending their time with, has more specific prayer requests, and can empathize with some of the cultural differences and struggles that may have come up.

This was wonderfully eye-opening to me and the team and I want to encourage you to consider stepping out of your own comfort zone to have your horizons expanded and relationships deepened whether in Minnesota or abroad.

AND A CHILD WILL LEAD THEM

My earliest memories of “big church” were sitting with my mom and singing hymns at the top of my lungs. I would pretend to read the lyrics from the hymnal and everyone around me would say how cute it was. There were no musical instruments at our little church, so you can imagine how loud I really must have been with just voices to carry the tune.

I was born with a birth defect that caused me to be completely deaf in my right ear. Even so, as the years went by, I found a rooted love of all types of music. This led me on a journey to explore gospel music, southern gospel, and eventually mainstream worship music. Regardless of the genre, from pop to jazz, music has always been spiritual for me. It has been an incredible gift as a way to learn Scripture and to learn how to worship.

Now, as a parent, I have seen the effects of how exposing my children to different styles of worship music at young ages is influencing them. My one-year-old daughter, Mazie, who was born with the same birth defect as I was, is already showing signs of being a music lover. I remember when my son James was two, we started bringing him in to worship with us on the weekends. He would sing at the top of his lungs—yep, just like mama! We were worshipping together as a family and showing him what it looks

like to worship as a faith community. We were amazed at how quickly he learned the songs and would just randomly start singing them at home while playing with his super heroes.

Isn’t it interesting that at the youngest of ages, worship is defined and understood within the confines of music and music alone? Music is a great starting point for understanding how to worship our Creator. This foundation has allowed me to further expand my definition of worship and recognize that worship exists in other ways, too—sacrificial giving, prayers of adoration, and so much more. It’s an obvious practical step to suggest that as parents we invite our children into our environment of worship in “big church,” but wouldn’t it be interesting this month if you, the parent, invited yourself into your child’s environment of worship? To have our kids see us worshipping alongside them in ways we might see as silly or goofy is actually an opportunity to affirm their approach to worshipping their Creator. In this way, we allow their foundation to be further cemented by our example. My prayer for you this month is that through these practical steps you will have a hand in shaping the next generation’s approach and understanding of worship that includes, but is not limited to, music.

Parents: Consider joining your children in their environment this month and allow them to lead you in worship.
